December Bonsai by John Miller

Editor's Note: John Miller, who writes a monthly column for the Bonsai Society of Dallas and the Fort Worth Bonsai Society, has agreed to share his column with us. We need to make adjustments for our warmer, climate, with its early springs, long summers, late falls and erratic winters.

This article may look strange to some since it is strictly from my head. I do not have access to my files right now.

And that may be good since this past summer and continuing into fall has not been a good experience for most. I did not lose any trees to the heat per se. I missed getting water in one pot for some reason and lost that one. I believe that our greatest problem this summer was not the 100+ degree daytime temperature. I feel that the biggest stress on the trees was that the night temperatures stayed above 80 degrees. The trees had no time to recover.

For the first time in 40 years, I managed to work on my planned schedule. Some days when I would have been forced off I was saved by my 10 year old grand-daughter Raven who stayed with us the entire summer. I trust her to do it more than any adult available out here in the boonies. She also turned into a very good and efficient leaf pruner this year.

My desired schedule which is based upon observations by myself, articles and experiments researched by Dr. Bill Cody, and some discussions with Mark Bynum is to water at 2pm and then again at sundown. Foliage was usually misted also especially the junipers. The 2pm watering resulted in the trees roots being cooled to water main temperature and the tree being throughly refreshed at the start of peak afternoon stress. Evaporative cooling of the soil and the pot covering helped also. The sundown watering then was able to recool the roots and the evaporative cooling helped counteract the lack of nighttime cooling.

Note: the watering does not negate the need for protecting the plants from full midsummer sun or the need to cover the pots loosely to minimize soil heat buildup. There is nothing magical about the above schedule. It just recognizes the plants needs and tries to fill them. Work schedules seldom allow for perfect horticulture practices. You just have to work hard to minimize the stress. A soaker hose drip watering system would help. I used to go out before gooing to work and do a 15 min spray aover all the bonsai using a very fine droplet spray. Other things might be devised to help.

The nice thing about December bonsai is that, outside of watching the watering, there is nothing that just has to be done in December. Anything that could be done in December could also be done in November or put off to the new year.

Some of the mundane chores that could be considered result in you having an easier time next year. They result in cleanliness and pathogen control and being ready for repotting. Cleanliness and pathogen control sometimes go hand in hand.

Remove the top half inch of soil (more or less depending on size) from your pots and replace it with fresh soil. You will remove last years weed seeds and spent or decayed fertilizer. That will allow for better and easier water penetration. Especially important if you are not repotting that tree. continue ..pg6

Many pathogens over-winter on the trees. A dormant spray can go far to help control them next summer. For deciduous trees a dormant spay strength of lime-sulphur will get into the bark crannies and kille both insects, eggs, larvae, mites and fungal spores. Just be sure that you protect the soil from the caustic spray drips. A dormant oil spray may be used and will handle insects and eggs fairly well but it does not have the seeall-killall effect of the l-s.

A good many commercial bonsai nurseries will strip the entire area clean and use a stronger lime-sulphur spray on the benches and any hard surfaces. Maybe even on the ground under the benches especially if they have too much fungal type problems.

For evergreens, do not use the lime-sulphur. Use the dormant oil spray. Any summer oil spray may be used, it is merely a lighter version oil spray that does not (usually) damage foliage in warm weather. Be sure to observe your evergreens closely for any problems that may be lurking quietly but doing their dirty work.

Now is the time to check your supply of akadama, pumice, lave, or any other potting materials you need. If you mix different sized soils using equal parts APL, you will be ready for all to come. Just add a handful of something if you need to alter for some special plant, e.g. I usually add a bit more akadama for chinese elms.
