Now that most of our trees nave been repouted and settled into their new homes it's time to work on everything above the soil line. For our **Monthly Meeting** Terry Ward will discuss methods for creating realistic branch shapes. This is a **work-shop**, so bring your tools and one or more trees to work on. Advanced members will be available for consultation during the workshop. There are a lot of misconceptions about how to grow branches, and many books only give details for maintaining the appearance of a branch. With this meeting we are hoping to throw new light on this often overlooked subject.

For the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday **Study Group** we are grateful to be able to offer an azalea workshop by George Brown. If you are unfamiliar with George, it's because he just joined ABS this year and we are very fortunate to have someone of his skill-level in our club. George brings with him over 20 years of experience with satsuki azaleas, and was an understudy of satsuki master Tatemori Gondo for three years. This is a **workshop** so bring your tools and trees. George insists that your azalea material does not have to be perfect. Bring anything from a seedling to a specimen. Or just come to listen and watch. This will be a fantastic workshop on Japanese azaleas!

Also, if you were unable to attend Chuck Ware's demonstration on soil theory as it relates to pot dimensions, well, you missed out. Half magic show and half Mr. Wizard, many of us were awestruck at what we saw. Several people came up to me and said that it was one of the most amazing demonstrations they've ever seen. Great job Chuck!

Though it was simply open repotting at the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday study group, many of us learned a thing or two about the design of our trees, and just simple techniques for untangling roots. And above all, we had a lot of fun. I'd like to acknowledge some special thanks to Chuck, Pat, and Charlotte for making this possible. It was a fun and informal workshop, and one that has the potential to become a club tradition.
